Rachel catches Monica waiting seductively (adv. 诱惑地) in her bedroom for Chandler;

To cover, Monica tells Rachel she's seeing a guy from work.

Monica tells Rachel that her new boyfriend is the best sex she's ever had, and when Chandler hears this he gets a little too proud of himself.

Ross finally gets Emily on the phone and they begin planning to work things out;

Emily agrees to come to New York but only if Ross doesn't see Rachel anymore.

After much agonizing(n. 苦恼 痛苦抉择), Ross agrees.

Joey gets involved with(v. 给：所缠住) a PBS pledge drive, believing he's the host; but he's only a phone jockey(=operator) and not even on camera.

Phoebe reveals her hatred for PBS, which started because she never got an answer to a letter she wrote to Sesame Street after her mom died.

Joey and Phoebe argue about whether any truly selfless good deeds exist, so Phoebe tries repeatedly to find one.

[Scene: Monica and Rachel's, Rachel has just gotten home and is going through the mail. She finds something that's Monica's and goes over and knocks on **her closed bedroom door.**]

go through v. 浏览

Monica: (In a sexy voice) Come in. I've been waiting for you.

(Rachel enters.)

Rachel: Hi! I just wanna-(sees Monica)-Ahhh!!! Oh my God! (She **runs out in horror.**) Oh my God!

Monica: (pulling on a robe) Okay, I'm sorry! I'm sorry! I-I-I was um, I was taking a nap.

pull on v. 穿 戴/robe n. 浴衣 睡袍/take a nap v. 小睡一下 睡午觉



Rachel: Since when do you take naps **in that position.** Oh God Monica, tell me you were waiting for a guy! Please tell me you were waiting for a guy!

Monica: Yes. Yes, I was. A guy. From work. (Thinks) I'm seeing a guy from work! Ha!

Rachel: (Gasps) That cute waiter guy from your restaurant, the one that looks like a **non-threatening** Ray Liotta?

Ray Liotta:(born December 18, 1954) is a Golden Globe-nominated American actor. He is well known for his roles in the Hollywood films Something Wild, Field of Dreams, Goodfellas, and Cop Land./Ray Liotta ‘瑞秋撞见正在等钱德勒的莫尼卡’莫尼卡只好假称自己在等一个同事°瑞秋误以为是那个长得有点像雷·利奥塔(Ray Liotta)‘又不像利奥塔那么危险的那个侍应生°雷·利奥塔是美国著名的影星’曾经主演过《汉尼拔》、《迫在眉睫》、《美国毒枭》和《好家伙》等影片’长相英俊’但略带邪恶和神秘°



Monica: Uh-huh, that one!

Rachel: Y’know what, just give me a second and I’ll be **out of your hair**. I’m just gonna **grab a jacket**. When I get back, I want every little detail. (There’s a knock on the door.) Maybe that’s him. (Goes to answer the door.)

Monica: (Panicking) Okay, umm, okay, umm: (Rachel opens the door.) It’s just Joey and Ross.

panicking adj. 慌张的

Rachel: Why aren’t you guys **at the movie**?

Joey: Well, we were! But Ross was talking so loud **on his phone** they **threw us out**!

throw sb up v. 扫地出门

Ross: I had to talk loud because the movie was loud!

Joey: (to Monica and Rachel) He’s talking to London!

Monica: Oh My God! Did he get in touch with Emily?

get in touch with v. 和...取得联系

Joey: Well no, not yet. He's calling everyone on her side of the family hoping that someone will help him get in touch with her.

Ross: (on phone) I-I-I don't care if I said some other girl's name you prissy, old twit!

prissy adj. 神经质的 为小事挂虑的/twit n. 愚弄嘲笑/prissy <俚>stuck up, goody-two-shoes, self-centered, all-knowing, hard to please bitches/twit<俚>The kind of person that makes a retarded(adj. 智力迟缓的)chimp look smart.

Joey: Ross! Way to suck up to the family.

suck up 'Somebody who will generally do ANYTHING for another person, and they will agree to anything said by that person as well. They will never disagree nor argue no matter what. Also known as a sheep/Way to suck up to the family. joey 讽刺 ross ' 你给她家人拍马屁拍得可真好啊 !

Chandler: (entering, happily, with a bottle of champagne, thinking that Monica is the only one there) Ha-ha-ha-(sees everyone)-enh-enh. I'm so glad you guys are all here! My office finally got wrinkle-free fax paper!

wrinkle-free adj. 无皱的/fax paper n. 传真纸

[Scene: Monica and Rachel's, the next morning, Phoebe, Chandler, Ross, and Monica are eating breakfast.]

Ross: Hi, is this Nanny Hopkins? I'm looking for Emily.Waltham. Oh, I'm sorry. Is this 0-1-1-4-4-7-4-2-9-3-4-7-4-2-6-7? Oh, it's 4-3, not 4-2.Well, which 4-2?

Joey: (entering, wearing a tux) Hey!

Chandler: Oh no-no-no-no-no-no, vomit tux! No-no, vomit tux!

Joey: Don't worry, I had it dry-cleaned.

dry-clean v. 干洗

Monica: Vomit tux? Who vomited on | y'know what, what you up to Joe?

Joey: Well, I'm doing this telethon thing on TV and my agent got me a job as co-host!

Monica: Oh that's great!

Joey: A little uh, good deed for PBS plus some TV exposure, now that's the kind of math Joey likes to do!

Phoebe: Okay, 'cause right after my mom killed herself, I was just in this really bad place, y'know personally. So, I just thought that it'd make me feel better if I wrote to *Sesame Street*, 'cause they were so nice when I was a little kid! No one ever **wrote back**.

Chandler: Well y'know a lot of those Muppets don't have thumbs.

Phoebe: All I got was a lousy keychain! And by that time I was living in a box. I didn't have keys!

Joey: I'm sorry Pheebbs, I just, y'know, I just wanted to **do a good deed**. Like-like you did with the babies.

Phoebe: This isn't a good deed, you just wanted to get on TV! This is totally selfish.

Joey: Whoa! Whoa! Whoa! What about you, having those babies for your brother? Talk about selfish!

Phoebe: What-what are you talking about?!

Joey: Well, yeah, it was a really nice thing and all, but it made you feel really good right?

and all adv. 的确

Phoebe: Yeah. So?

Joey: It made **you** feel good, so that makes it selfish. Look, there's no unselfish good deeds, sorry.

unselfish adj. 不自私的

Phoebe: Yes there are! There are totally good deeds that are selfless.

selfless adj. 无私的

Joey: Well, may I ask for one example?

Phoebe: Yeah, it's : Y'know there's | no you may not!

(They are standing on either side of Chandler as they discuss the point. Chandler, meanwhile, is disgusted with the whole argument.)

be disgusted with v. 嫌 讨厌 唾弃

Joey: That's because all people are selfish.

Phoebe: Are you calling me selfish?!

Joey: Are you calling you people? (Chandler rolls his eyes.) Yeah, well sorry to burst that bubble, Pheeb, but selfless good deeds don't exist. Okay? And you know the deal on Santa Claus right?

Phoebe: I'm gonna find a selfless good dead. I'm gonna beat you, you evil genius.

evil genius n. 邪恶天才



(Ross's phone rings and he answers it.)

Ross: (on phone) Hello.

Emily: (on phone from London) Hello, Ross?

Ross: Emily? Emily! Oh my God! Oh my God, it's Emily! (He picks up a lamp and hands it to Chandler, **for no reason.**) It's Emily everyone! Shush-shush-shhst! (to Emily) Hi!

shush int. 嘘!n. 嘘声

Emily: Ross, I'm only **ringing to** say stop harassing my relatives. Good-bye!

Ross: No wait! Look, wait! Okay, you can hang up, but I'm gonna keep calling! I'm gonna, I'm gonna call everyone in England if **that's what it takes to get you to talk to me!**

Emily: Really? About what?

Ross: Look you're my wife. We're-we're married. Y'know? I-I love you. I-I really miss you.

Emily: I miss you too. Well, at least I think I do.

Ross: (to the gang, whispering) She's talking.

All: (subdued) Yay! (He **motions for** them to keep quiet, including Chandler who is still holding the lamp Ross handed him, before he **goes off to** talk to Emily in private.)

Phoebe: Hey, Joey, when you said the deal with Santa Claus, you meant?

Joey: That he doesn't exist.

Phoebe: Right. (She turns and opens her eyes in shock.)

[Scene: Central Perk, Chandler, Monica, and Rachel are there.]

Rachel: So Chandler, have you heard about Monica's secret boyfriend?

Chandler: Uhh, yeah. She uh, she uh, she uh might've mentioned him.

Rachel: So Mon, when are we gonna meet this new secret waiter man?

Monica: Ohh, he's really shy. I-I don't think he's up to meeting everyone yet.

be up to v. 胜任 从事于

Chandler: Yeah, I don't think he's up to meeting everyone yet.

Rachel: I don't care! I wanna meet this guy who's the best sex she ever had!

(Chandler is quite pleased with that statement.)

Chandler: Really?! That's what you heard? (To Monica) You said that?

Monica: I might've said that. (Chandler laughs.) Why is that funny?

Chandler: Because I'm very happy for him! (To Monica) And **you**, you lucky dog!

lucky dog <俚>幸运儿

Ross: (entering) Hi!

Monica: Hey!

Ross: Well, Emily's willing to work on the relationship.

be willing to 乐意于

Chandler: Yes!

Monica: That's great!

Ross: In London!

Monica: What?!

Ross: She wants me to move to London.

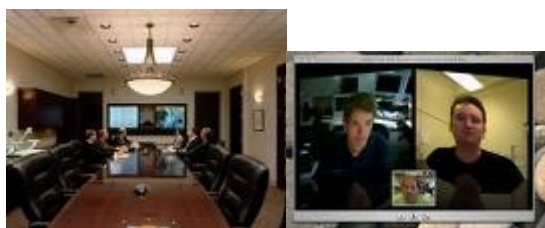
Monica: But you live here! (Ross rolls his eyes.) You know that.

Rachel: What-what-what are you gonna do?

Ross: I don't know 'I mean, I can't leave Ben.

Chandler: You can just video-conference with him. I'm not ready to have a child.

video-conference n. v. 视频会议



Ross: I bet if I talk to Carol and Susan I can convince them to move to London with Ben.

Monica: Yeah, I'm sure your ex-wife will be more than happy to move to another country so you can patch things up with your new wife.

patch up v. 平息 修补 重归于好 (relationship)

Ross: It could happen.

[Carol and Susan's 'Ross is trying to convince Carol]

Carol 'Ross, we are not moving to London. We already have lives here.

Ross: But it'd be great. They have great theater 'great accents 'tea. They have a queen.

Carol 'So?

Ross: She's a woman.

Ben 'Daddy!

Ross: Hey! Guess what? We're moving to London!

Susan '(at a loss) Who's going to London?

Carol 'Nobody's going to London.

Ross: Welcome to London, governor. Right, right. It'll be great because we'll have Big Ben and little Ben in the same city. **Go pack!** See? See, he wants to go.

Susan 'Yeah, we leave all our big decisions to the 3-year-old.

Ross: Come on, come on. It'll be just like Three's Company 'only there's a kid and my wife and you're the gay ones.

[Scene: Unitel Video, Studio 55, Joey's telethon, he is being **shown around** by the stage director.]

Joey: (To the **pledge volunteers**) How ya doin'? Welcome. **Good to see ya!**

Stage Director: This will be your phone.

Joey: That's great. But uh, I'm not really expecting a lot of calls.

Stage Director: No you answer it and take pledges.

Joey: But I'm the host!

Stage Director: No, Gary Collins is the host. You'll be answering the phones.

Joey: You don't seem to understand. See, I was Dr. Drake Remoray.

Stage Director: Well, here's your phone doctor. (She walks away.)

[Scene: Monica and Rachel's, Phoebe, Rachel, and Monica are there.]

Phoebe: I cannot believe I can't find a **selfless good deed**! Y'know that **old guy** that lives next to me? Well, I **snuck over there** and-and raked up all the leaves on his front stoop. But he caught me and force-fed me cider and cookies. Then I felt wonderful. That old jackass!

Rachel: Maybe Joey's right. Maybe all good deeds are selfish.

Phoebe: I will find a selfless good deed! 'Cause I just gave birth to three children and I will not let them be raised in a world where Joey is right!

Chandler: (entering) Hey, Monica? Can I ask you a cooking question?

Monica: Sure!

Chandler: If you're cooking on the stove, does that mean that your new secret boyfriend is better in bed than Richard?

stove n. 炉



Rachel: Chandler! (Pause) Is he?

Monica: Well, y'know I-I-I think I'm gonna respect the privacy of my new secret boyfriend.

Chandler: Why?! I mean if this guy was ~~me~~ and it was ~~me~~ who had learned that it was ~~me~~ who was the best you'd ever had, I'd be going like this. (He jumps up onto the table and starts doing his happy dance.)

[Scene: Ross's apartment, he's on the phone with Emily.]

be on the phone with sb 与某人正在通电话

Ross: All right Emily, as much as I love you, I'm sorry, I can't move to London without Ben.

as much as adv. 差不多 尽管... 那么多

Emily: I understand that would be difficult.

Ross: Yeah, would you please consider moving here? I mean you were gonna move here anyway, why can't you just do that?

Emily: I don't know, it's just :

Ross: Oh-oh-okay, but-but **I** know, that even though I've been a-a complete idiot **up 'til now**, I mean, I mean you-you-you have to come here. You have to come here so we can **work this out together**.

Emily: All right.

Ross: All right, did you just say all right?

Emily: I did. Now I'm the idiot.

Ross: Oh, Emily that is, that is so great. It's gonna be so great! We're gonna be like-like-like two idiots in love!

(She laughs.)

Emily: Ross, there's one thing that really **scares me still**.

Ross: Yes, tell me.

Emily: Well, you have to understand **how humiliating it was for** me upon that altar in front of my entire family, all my friends.

humiliating adj. 羞辱性的

Ross: I know. I am, I am so sorry.

Emily: And then after deciding to forgive you, seeing you at the airport catching our plane with her.

Ross: Again, very sorry.

Emily: I mean, I can't-I can't be in the same room as her! It **drives me mad** just thinking of you being in the same room as her!

Ross: Emily, there is **nothing** between Rachel and me. Okay? I love you.

Emily: All right. I'll come to New York and we'll **try and make this work**.

Ross: Oh that is so great! That's :

Emily: (interrupting him) As long as you don't see Rachel anymore.

Commercial Break

[Scene: Monica and Rachel's, Ross is telling Phoebe, Monica, and Chandler about Emily's ultimatum.]

ultimatum n. 最后通牒

Ross: So I asked Emily if she would come to New York, and she said yes.

Chandler: Yes!

Phoebe: Ooh-ohh!

Monica: Great!

Ross: No-no-no! Only if I promise never to see Rachel again.

Phoebe: Why?

Monica: What?! You can't | what did you tell her?

Ross: I told her I'd have to think about it. I mean, *how the hell am I supposed to* make this kind of a decision? (They're all quiet.) I'm **actually** asking you!

Chandler: Well, you can't just not see Rachel anymore, she's one of your best friends.

Monica: Yeah! But, he can't not exactly see Emily, I mean that's his wife.

Phoebe: Yeah.

Chandler: That's true!

Phoebe: Yeah, but you've known Rachel since High School and you cannot just *cut her out of your life*.

Chandler: ~~That's~~ true!

Monica: No, you cannot.

Ross: Thanks for the help, problem solved. (Wipes his hands.)

(The phone rings.)

Monica: (answering it) Hello.

Joey: (on phone) Hey Mon!

Monica: Oh hey Joey! We've been watching all day, when are you gonna be on TV?

Joey: See, there was kind of a mix-up in my agent's office, but I'm still on TV and that's good exposure.

mix-up 'a mistake that results from taking one thing to be another

Monica: (Looking at the TV) You're not on TV.

Joey: Oh, uh, okay, how, how about now? (He waves his hand in front of the woman next to him and you can now see his arm on TV.)

Chandler: Hey, there he is! There he is!

Joey: Hello New York! (The woman **bats his hand out of the way.**)

bat v. strike with or as if with a baseball bat

[Scene: Chandler and Joey's, the chick and the duck are watching Emeril Live, a cooking show.]

Emeril Live 'is a program on Food Network hosted by Emeril Lagasse. Emeril Live features many of the same elements as Emeril's other show, Essence of Emeril, and often has a Creole theme. The show is taped in front of a live audience in New York and features music played by Doc Gibbs and the Emeril Live Band. In late 2004, the show moved to Chelsea Market.



Emeril: (on TV.) Now maybe you just like wanna but the whole duck in there! Who cares, y'know? Now I got the legs :

(Chandler enters and sees what they're watching, panics, and runs to turn off the TV.)

Chandler: How many times have I told you guys, you **never** watch the cooking channel!

Monica: (entering) Hi Chandler.

Chandler: Hey!

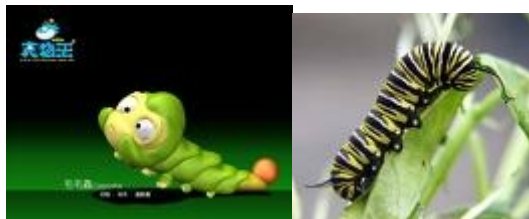
Monica: Uh, listen, I need that broiling pan that Joey borrowed the other day.

Monica: *William Sonoma*, fall catalog, Page 27.

Williams-Sonoma : (NYSE[New York Stock Exchange 纽约证券交易所]: WSM) is an American company that sells specialty cooking utensils(n. 器具) and other housewares(n. 家用器皿), along with a variety of foods including gourmet(n. 美食品尝家) coffees. Its principal office(n. 总店 总部) is in San Francisco, California. The company primarily generates revenue through retail and direct to[把(注意力精力)贯注在...上] customer. In 2005, the company operated 560 retail stores in the United States and Canada under its various brand names, including 255 Williams-Sonoma, 180 Pottery Barn and 90 Pottery Barn Kids stores. Chandler: Expect it in 4-6 weeks. (She starts to leave.) Umm, hey, umm, Joey's gonna be at the telethon for the rest of the day, we have the whole place to ourselves.

Monica: Yeah, so?

Chandler: Well I just, thought maybe you'd wanna book some time with the best you'd ever had.

Monica: Y'know what, champ? I think I'll pass.

Chandler: Why?

Chandler: What's your point?

Chandler: Well, I think I'd be a little out of my league, but I'd give it a shot.

[Scene: The Telethon, Joey's phone rings and he answers it.]

Joey: (in a bored voice) PBS telethon.

Phoebe: (on phone from Central Perk) Hey Joey, I just wanted to let you know that I found a selfless good deed :I just went down to the park and I let a bee sting me.

sting v. 刺

Joey: What?! What good is that gonna do anybody?

Phoebe: Well, it helps the bee look tough in front of his bee friends. The bee is happy and I am definitely not.

Joey: Now, y'know the bee probably died after he stung ya.

Phoebe: (Thinks for a moment.) Aw, dammit! (Slams the phone down.)

Stage Director: Back on in 30 seconds people!

(Joey gets up and moves to the other end of his row to talk to the guy sitting there.)

Joey: Hey, excuse me, would you mind switching with me?

PBS Volunteer: Hey, no way, I'm in the shot 'man.

Joey: Come on man! You've been here all day!

PBS Volunteer: Yeah, I-I'm taking pledges here, eh?

Stage Director: We're on in 3, 2, (points to Gary Collins.)

Gary Collins: Welcome back to our fall telethon. Now if you've been enjoying the performance of *Cirque Du Soleil*, (As he is speaking, Joey and the volunteer getting into a shoving match.) and you'd like to see more of the same kind of programming, it's very simple. All you have to do (Joey is knocked down.) is call in your pledge and at that time tell the operator, one of our volunteers, what kind of programming you'd like to: (Just as the volunteer sits down, Joey pulls him to the ground.)

Gauthier, who left the company in 2001, now owns the ski area Le Massif, on the St. Lawrence River in Quebec. Cirque du Soleil is now “guided” by Laliberté.

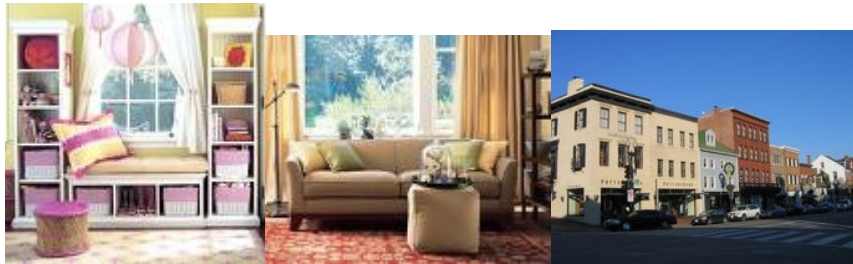


[Scene: Monica and Rachel's, Monica and Phoebe are cooking, Chandler is reading a magazine.]

Chandler: Quick broiling pan question :

Monica: Yes, it really does **cost that much**. Maybe next time your duck can **puke in** something from Pottery Barn.

puke v. 呕吐/ Pottery Barn 'is an American-based chain of home furnishing stores with stores in the United States and Canada. It is a wholly owned subsidiary of Williams-Sonoma, Inc. which acquired it in 1986. The company began in 1949 as a single store in Lower Manhattan. Pottery Barn Kids exclusively features children's furniture and accessories. Pottery Barn stores are divided into three main areas to include; Design Studio, Grand Lobby and Table Top. Design Studio's focus is on furniture sales and accounts for the majority of the company's business. Pottery Barn Teen (PBTeen) serves the tastes of preteens(13 岁以下的) through the college years, since their tastes are much different than those of the young adult to middle-aged era. The best looking Pottery Barn is located on 67th and Broadway.



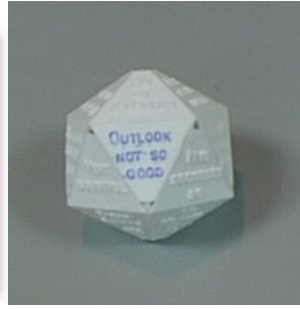

The fortunes are given by a white plastic die(n. 骰子) in the shape of an icosahedron(n. 二十四面体), floating in a blue liquid, with answers to yes-no questions in raised letters on its 20 triangular faces. There is a transparent window on the bottom of the 8-ball, and when the ball is held so that the window faces up, the die floats to the top randomly exposing one of its faces in the window. As the raised white letters press against the window, they drive the dark blue liquid to the sides, away from the raised letters, so that the letters appear as white print on a still-dark-blue background (where a thin layer of fluid remains between the raised letters).
