Joey gets nominated for a "Soapie" award for his return as Drake Ramoray in Days of Our Lives.

He loses, but he steals a trophy from one of his co-stars (Jessica) who doesn't appreciate it.

Rachel, Phoebe, and Joey practice receiving awards.

Ross makes Dinosaur sounds for his class.

A male student (Ned) reveals he's in love with Ross, claiming that's why he's doing so poorly in class.

Ross sympathizes(vi. 同情) and decides to change Ned's grade for the better, until he finds out it's just a scam(n. 诡计).

Phoebe's new romance with Jake makes Monica realize that once she's married, she'll never have another "first kiss" or be with anyone else.

[Scene: Central Perk, Phoebe and Monica are there]

Rachel 'So, Pheebs, you know, I was just at this bachelorette party and they had a cake that was in the shape of a man's thing-a-ding-ding. And I was wondering, what would you have thought of that? Offensive or amusing?

Phoebe 'I'm not sure. Monica, what do you think?

Monica 'Sounds kind of tacky.

Rachel 'Damn it. I'll see if they can cancel it. If not, maybe they can put eyes on the 'hoojies' and we'll just say it's just some sort of weird elephant.

hoojie<俚>A word that should give one a sour(adj. 酸的) feeling; it is used often like a noun or adjective to describe something distasteful(adj. 讨厌的). The word can be stated randomly, without any prompting, and one should let out a slight chuckle (ever so slight). One could describe another's words to be "hoojie," or one's ideas, but hoojie cannot describe another's clothes, or their accessories.

(Rachel heads for the bathroom as Joey is entering excitedly)

Joey: Hey! You guys! You're not gonna believe this! I just got off the phone with my agent :

Phoebe: Oh my God! (Joey looks at her.) I'm sorry, too soon. You go.

Joey: Okay. I got nominated for my part on *Days of Our Lives*!

Monica: Joey!

Phoebe: Good for you!

Monica: Congratulations! Wow! I can't believe you're nominated for an *Emmy*!

The Emmy Award is an American television production award, similar in nature to the Peabody Awards but more focused on entertainment, and are considered the TV equivalent of the Oscars. Three related but separate organizations present Emmy Awards: 1) the Academy of Television Arts & Sciences honors national prime time entertainment excluding sports; 2) the National Academy of Television Arts & Sciences recognizes daytime, sports, news and documentary programming, and; 3) the International Academy of Television Arts & Sciences honors programming originating outside the United States. The best-known of the awards are the Primetime Emmys, and the Daytime Emmy Awards, with both having categories classified as Creative Arts Emmys.



Joey: No-no.

Monica: Oh *Soap Opera Digest* award!

The Soap Opera Digest Awards are an award show held by the daytime television magazine Soap Opera Digest. The awards were founded in 1984 to replace the less-lavish (adj. 浪费的) Soapy Award; those award shows had run since 1977. The Soap Opera Digest Awards are meant to promote excellence in the soap opera genre and are decided by the fans who read the magazine. The statue itself is currently made of crystal, and is in the shape of a heart. The first Soap Opera Digest Award show aired in 1984, and was featured on national syndicated television and hosted by then husband and wife Catherine Hickland and David Hasselhoff. One of the reasons for the move up was the new-found audience of both Daytime and Prime time soap operas. That year for the first time awards were given to prime time soap operas as well as daytime soaps. This practice was phased out (v. 逐步淘汰) in the 1990s as primetime soap operas began losing the large appeal they once had. For the first two years fans themselves voted on the nominees list as well as the winners. This had the side effect that in 1985 the soap opera Days of our Lives swept most every category. The third awards were changed so that the editors of the magazine chose the nominees and every reader was allowed one ballot (n. 选票) to vote for their favorites. This allowed other shows like Santa Barbara and Another World to take home trophies. A change in award season from the end of the year to the beginning meant that there was no show in 1987. In 1992 the awards were broadcast live for the first time; in addition, the award statue (previously a flat crystal heart) was redesigned to be taller. NBC had been broadcasting the Soap Opera Digest Awards since the show made its way to network TV, but the show would no longer be seen on the network after the airing of the 2000 awards. The year 2001 marked the first time that there was no awards ceremony and voting was done entirely online. In 2003 the cable channel SOAPnet broadcast the awards which were hosted by Daytime Emmy nominated hosts Lisa Rinna and Ty Treadway. No awards were given out in 2002 or 2004. The 2005 awards were done entirely through the magazine. Fans could find a ballot in a November issue of Soap Opera Digest and then mail it to the editors. Only one

ballot per person was counted. The awards were announced in the magazine in February 2005.

Monica: (to Joey) Okay, I'll go!

Rachel: No!! You are getting married! This is all I have.

Phoebe 'We should celebrate.

Rachel: Yes! And we will get you a cake in the shape of a microphone.

Phoebe 'With two tennis balls.

Opening Credits

[Scene: N.Y.U, Ross is giving a lecture.]

Ross: : and it was Ernst Muhlbrat who first hypothesized that the Velociraptor when threatened would expand its collar and emit a high pitched noise to frighten off its predator. (A student raises his hand.) Yes Mr. Lewis?

Ross: Okay! (Walks away from him.) Umm, I uh, I'm your teacher. I'm sorry, you're-you're a student and I-and I like women. In spite of what may be written on the backs of some of these chairs.

[Scene: Central Perk, Monica and Phoebe are drinking coffee and Phoebe notices a cute guy checking them out.]

Phoebe: Oh my God! That guy at the counter is totally checking you out!

Monica: Really? (Looks.) My God, he's really cute.

Phoebe: Go for it.

Monica: Phoebe, I'm engaged!

Phoebe: I'm just saying, get his number just in case. But no Chandler is in an accident and can't perform sexually and he would want you to take a lover to satisfy the needs that he can no longer fulfill.

The Cute Guy: (To Monica) Hi!

Monica: Op, can I just tell you something? Very flattered but umm, I'm engaged. (Points to her ring.)

The Cute Guy: Wow! Uh, this is kind of embarrassing. I was actually coming over to talk to your friend.

Monica: Well you should be embarrassed. (Leaves.)

The Cute Guy: (To Phoebe) I thought you knew I was looking at you.

Phoebe: I did, but that was really fun.

[Scene: Joey and Rachel's, Joey is sitting in the chair.]

Joey: (pretending to be an announcer) And the winner is : Joey Tribbiani! (He then gets excited and goes over to the counter to practice his acceptance speech using a bottle of maple syrup as the award.) Oh : Wow! I honestly never expected this. I uh, I didn't prepare a speech. But umm, I'd like to thank (Rachel enters quietly) my parents, who've always been there for me. I'd also like to thank my friends, Chandler, Monica, Phoebe, Rachel :

Joey: What award are you practicing for?

Rachel: *Grammy*, Best New Artist.

Best New Artist n. 最佳新晋艺人奖/The Grammy Awards (originally called the Gramophone Awards) are presented annually by the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences of the United States for outstanding achievements in the record industry. The President of the Academy is Neil Portnow. It is one of four major music awards shows held annually in the U.S.; the others are the American Music Awards, the Billboard Music Awards, and the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony. However, the Grammys, usually held in February, are considered to be the U.S. record industry's equivalent to the Academy Awards (or Oscars) for motion pictures. The 50th Annual Grammy Awards will take place on Sunday, February 10, 2008 at the Staples Center in Los Angeles, CA. Nominations will be announced on December 6, 2007.



Joey: Oh, hey listen! The Soapie's called today and I also **get to present** an award.

Monica: Joey.

Phoebe: (enters) Oh hey!

Monica: Hey! How'd your date go with Jake?

Phoebe: Oh, great! We couldn't keep our eyes off each other all night and then every once and a while y-know, he'd kinda lean over and stroke my hair and touch my neck. (Does that to Monica.)

Phoebe: Are you just realizing this now?

Monica: No. Maybe. Yes! I've been so busy planning the wedding that I forgot about all the things that I'd be giving up! I mean, I : I'm never gonna have a first kiss again.

Phoebe: You'll have a last kiss.

[Scene: Joey and Rachel's, Ross is helping Joey with his tie.]

Ross: Can I ask you something? Have you ever had a guy have a crush on you?

Joey: Is that why you wanted to tie my tie?

Ross: There's this kid in my class who said he's in love with me.

Joey: Whoa!

Rachel: (entering from her room) Whoa what?

Joey: Ross has a boyfriend.

Ross: I do-I do **not** have a boyfriend. There's a guy in one of my classes who-who has a crush on me.

Rachel: Really?

Ross: Yeah! I don't know. I mean, last year Elizabeth now-now this kid. What-what-what-what is it?! Am I giving out some kind of : sexy professor vibe? (Rachel and Joey both look at him.)

Ross: It-it | The point is my natural charisma has made him fail his midterm.

Jake: Bye Phoebe.

Phoebe: Okay bye. (They kiss.)

Jake: All right. Bye. (Backs out the door.)

Phoebe: Bye!

Jake: Bye!

Phoebe: Bye!

Jake: I'll miss you!

Phoebe: I'll miss you too! (Phoebe goes over and **joins** Monica on the couch.) We said good-bye at the door **so as not to** flaunt our new love.

Monica: Phoebe, it's okay. You don't have to **tiptoe around me**. I-I've been thinking about it and umm, y-know what? I'm okay about **not** having that new relationship feeling:

Hey Phoebe and I were just talking about how our relationship is **deep and meaningful**. It really is don't you think?

Chandler: Oh totally! (Holds up his finger.) Pull my finger.

Rachel: Oh, well, I was in the bathroom, and Susan Lucci came out of a **stall** and she had toilet paper on her shoe, so I took it.

Susan Victoria Lucci (born December 23, 1946) is a Daytime Emmy Award winning actress. Lucci has been called "Daytime's Leading Lady" by TV Guide. Lucci attended

Garden City High School in Garden City, New York, graduating in 1964. She then attended Marymount College at Fordham University, and graduated from Marymount in 1968.



(the presenter walks to the podium)

Announcer: Presenting the award for Favorite Returning Male Character is McKensize :

[Cut to Joey and Rachel's table.]

Joey: (To Rachel) This is it! This is my category.

Rachel: I know! My God! Do you have your speech?

Joey: Yeah, I got my speech!

Rachel: Do you got your gracious loser face?

Joey: Yeah. (Does it.)

Rachel: Now Joey remember, if you win you have to hug me! You hug me!

Joey: Okay. Can I squeeze your ass?

Rachel: On TV?! Yeah!

Joey: —Kay!

[Cut to the presenter.]

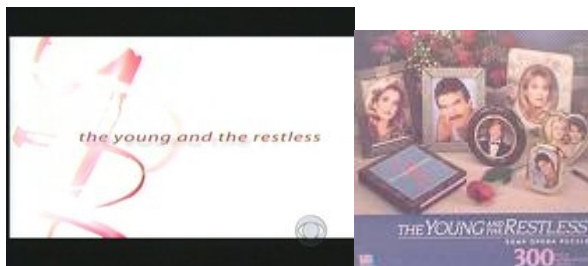

In the category of Favorite Returning Male Character the nominees are: John Wheeler from *General Hospital* (Applause), Gavin Grant from *The Young and the Restless* (Applause), Dunkin Harrington from *Passions* (Applause), and Joey Tribbiani from *Days of Our Lives* (Applause). The Young and the Restless (commonly abbreviated as Y&R) is a popular American television soap opera, first broadcast on CBS on March 26, 1973. Y&R was created by William J. Bell and Lee Phillip Bell, who set their show in a fictional version of Genoa City, Wisconsin, a town near their annual vacation home in Lake Geneva.



Passions is a American television soap opera created by veteran writer James E. Reilly. It debuted on NBC on July 5, 1999, replacing the long running soap opera Another World, and its final airdate on NBC will be September 7, 2007. The series will begin airing new episodes on DirecTV-exclusive channel The 101 on September 17, 2007.



Days of our Lives is an American soap opera, which has aired nearly every weekday since November 8, 1965 on the NBC network in the United States, and has since been syndicated to many countries around the world. The series was created by husband-and-wife team Ted Corday and Betty Corday, and many of the first stories were written by William J. Bell.



Joey: What the?! (Joey pounds the table and starts yelling at Rachel, and which is drowned out by applause. Rachel is desperately trying to tell Joey that he's on TV right now. He finally notices and he does his gracious loser face.)

[Scene: The 2001 Soapie Awards, the announcer is introducing the next presenter.]

Announcer: Presenting the award for Favorite Supporting Actress is Joey Tribbiani from *Days of Our Lives*. (Applause as Joey angrily walks to the podium and eyes the trophy.)

Joey: (angrily and monotone) Any one of the brilliant actresses nominated for this award tonight deserves to take it home. Unfortunately only one can. (Shakes his head in disgust.) The nominees for Best Supporting Actress are from *Passions* Erin Goff. (There is applause, which Joey disgustedly waits to die out.) From *One Life to Live* Mary Loren Bishop (They start to applaud again, but Joey interrupts in with the rest of the nominees), from *All My Children* Sarah Mchann, and from *Days of Our Lives* Jessica Ashley. And the winner is: (Opens the envelope): Jessica Ashley from *Days of Our Lives*. (Applause) Uh, unfortunately Jessica couldn't be with us tonight so I'll be accepting this award on her behalf. (Realizes something) And I'm sure that Jessica would like to thank my parents who always believed in me. She'd also like to thank my friends, Chandler, Monica, Ross, Phoebe, and Rachel who's sittin' right there! (Points at Rachel.) (The music starts and his microphone is turned off, this angers Joey again and he disgustedly exits.)

Originally a half-hour in length, the show expanded to an hour in April 1977. Previously, the show had experimented with the hour format for one week starting on July 7, 1975, when Ryan's Hope premiered. It is recorded at ABC's television studio on West 66th Street in New York City. As of July 31, 2006, the show began using a post-production process called FilmLook, which gives it a filmed (as opposed to taped) appearance.



[Scene: Joey and Rachel's, Joey and Rachel are entering.]

Rachel: Joey! Why did we have to rush out of there so fast?! I was this close to getting Luke and Laura to sign Susan Lucci's toilet paper.

Luke Spencer and Laura Webber Spencer are fictional characters and the signature supercouple on the American soap opera General Hospital. Luke is played by Anthony Geary and Laura was played by Genie Francis. Despite having been raped by a drunken Luke, Laura would later fall in love with him. Though other supercouples came before them, Luke and Laura are the most well known outside of the soap opera realm(n. 领域), and are credited with defining the term "supercouple," which caused other soap operas to copy the successful formula. Originally, critics of the soap opera genre panned(<口>严厉地批评) the unlikely pairing, as very few (if any) rape victims fall in love with their rapists. However, the duo became wildly popular in spite of Luke's past misdeed. They wed on November 16, 1981, with 30 million viewers tuning in. The episode was the highest-rated hour in soap opera history. They were married for two decades and had two children. Even today, their union still has a presence in Port Charles. On internet message boards, the couple is often referred to as "L&L" or "LnL" (for Luke and Laura). Rachel: All right? (He sets the award down.) Thank you.

Joey: I'll take it back tomorrow.

Rachel: Thank you.

(He goes into his room and closes the door. Rachel goes to pick it up and :)

Joey: (opening his door) If I can't have it 'you can't have it!
(Rachel walks away angrily.)

[Scene: Ross's Classroom, he is writing on the board and Alan is coming in to see him.]

Lewis: Professor Geller?

Ross: (turning towards him) Yes Mr. Lewis, how can I help you?

Lewis: I know I didn't do well on my midterms and stuff but, I was kinda hoping you could change my grade.

Ross: And why exactly would I do that? (Goes back to writing on the board.)

Lewis: Because I'm in love with you.

Ross: (turning around and dragging the chalk down the board) What?!

Lewis: Yeah, I'm all : in love with you and stuff. So could you change my grade?

Ross: No!

Lewis: Well why not ?you changed Ned's grade!

Ross: Well that's different! Okay? Because he, he was actually in love with me!

Lewis: No he's not! He's totally yanking your chain! He's done this with three other teachers!

Phoebe: That is correct! Yes, you're supposed to take all that stuff and put it in a little box in your mind and then lock it up tight.

Monica: Your mother told you this?

Phoebe: Yes!

Monica: The woman that got married a bunch of times and killed herself when you were 13?

Phoebe: Oh my God! You're right! Go! (Monica starts to leave.) Go tell Chandler! Hurry before it's too late! Wait no! (Monica stops.) Does this also mean putting-out doesn't get you love? (Monica is shocked.)

unexpected adj. 意想不到的/The Nobel Prizes are awarded for Physics, Chemistry, Literature, Peace, and Physiology or Medicine. More recently the Bank of Sweden has been awarding a non-official, but associated, Nobel memorial prize for "Economics". The first five prizes were instituted(vt. 创立) by the Swedish scientist Alfred Nobel through his will in 1895; they were first awarded in 1901. The prize for economics, The Sveriges(=Sweden) Riksbank Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel, was instituted by Sweden's central bank in 1968. The first prize in economics was awarded in 1969. All six prizes are widely regarded as the supreme commendations(n. 荣誉) in their subject areas. With the exception of (adv. 除: 以外) the peace prize, which is handed out in Oslo, Norway, they are all handed out in Stockholm at an annual ceremony on December 10, the anniversary of Nobel's death.



The Antoinette Perry Awards for Excellence in Theatre, or more commonly, the Tony Awards, is a recognition of achievement in live American theatre presented by the American Theatre Wing and the League of American Theatres and Producers at an annual ceremony in New York City. The awards are for Broadway productions and performances.

He is one of the most reliable hitmakers in Broadway history, as well as one of the most performed playwrights in the world. Simon briefly attended New York University in 1946. Two years later, he quit his job as a mailroom clerk in the Warner Brothers offices in Manhattan to write radio and television scripts with his brother Danny Simon. Their revues(n. 讽刺时事的滑稽剧) for Camp Tamiment in Pennsylvania in the early 1950s caught the attention of Sid Caesar, who hired the duo for his popular TV comedy series Your Show of Shows. (Simon later incorporated their experiences into his play Laughter on the 23rd Floor.) His work won him two Emmy Award nominations and the appreciation of Phil Silvers, who hired him to write for his eponymous(adj. 齐名的) sitcom in 1959.

Saturday Night Live (SNL) is a weekly late night 90 minute American comedy-variety show based in New York City that has been broadcast live by NBC on Saturday nights since October 11, 1975. It is one of the longest-running network entertainment programs in American television history. Each week, the show's cast is joined by a guest host and a musical act. Originally, the show was called NBC's Saturday Night until NBC retitled its show in 1976 (the Saturday Night Live title having been previously attached to a short-lived variety show(n. 杂耍表演) hosted by Howard Cosell and airing on rival network ABC). The first show with the new title was broadcast on March 26, 1977. The show | broadcast from Studio 8H at the GE Building (called the RCA Building until 1988) in New York's Rockefeller Center | has been the launching place for many major American comedy stars of the last thirty years. It was created by Canadian Lorne Michaels who, excluding a hiatus(n. 间歇期) from Season 6 through Season 10, has produced and written for the show and remains its executive producer (Jean Doumanian produced most of Season 6, and Dick Ebersol Seasons 7 - 10). In 2005, NBC renewed SNL's contract until 2012.
